

# **CONDITIONS OF ENTRY**

#### **NO BYO ALCOHOL - REFER TO LICENSING ACT**

- All competitors (or anyone mounted on a horse at any time) must be members of either Equestrian South Australia (ESA), Pony Club Association of South Australia (PCASA) or the Macclesfield Horse Show (MHS). Competitors who are members of the ESA must produce proof of <u>CURRENT MEMBERSHIP</u> at time of entry via Nominate to participate in events. Pony Club Riders must bring their PC card. Non-ESA Members must pay Macclesfield Horse Show Day Membership to compete. <u>A \$20 FEE WILL APPLY FOR Seniors (over 18 years of age) or \$10 (under 18 years of age) to become members of the MHS for the day.</u>
- 2. <u>ALL COMPETITORS</u> or their <u>PARENT/GUARDIAN (IF UNDER 18 yrs)</u> must sign a <u>RELEASE & WAIVER OF LIABILITY</u> at the TIME OF ENTRY *to EVENT PARTICIPATION*.
- 3. ANYONE MOUNTED ON OR DRIVING A HORSE ON THE GROUNDS AT ANY TIME DURING THE SHOW IS REQUIRED TO WEAR AN IDENTITY WRISTBAND. WRISTBANDS ARE AVAILABLE AT THE SECRETARIES OFFICE.
- 4. ALL ENTRIES VIA NOMINATE.COM.AU.
- 5. A \$15 PER RIDER GROUND FEE WILL BE CHARGED AT TIME OF ENTRY
- 6. A \$10 PER RIDER MEDICAL LEVY WILL BE CHARGED AT TIME OF ENTRY
- 7. NO BYO ALCOHOL due to Liquor Licensing Act.
- 8. NO LUNGEING OR EXERCISING HORSES ON THE OVAL.
- 9. NO HORSES TO BE TETHERED TO FENCES.
- 10. NO HORSES ALLOWED ON THE OVAL PRIOR TO OFFICIAL START TIME.
- 11. As an Affiliated Club we run under EA Rules. It is rider's responsibility to be aware of the EA rules and the CONCUSSION policy. This applies to ANYONE who intends to get on or drive a horse ANYWHERE ON THE GROUNDS. The rules apply to ANY fall, the rider and horse (if horse also falls) will need to be checked and cleared before remounting and continuing. We also need contact details for a person who would be available to take your vehicle and horse home in the event that you are unable to drive home yourself.
- 12. All persons entering the grounds shall hold the Committee harmless and indemnified against any legal proceedings arising from any accident, injury, loss or damage.
- 13. The Macclesfield Horse Show will not be held responsible for any accident that may be caused to or by any horse and it shall be a condition of entry that each nominator hold the Show blameless and shall indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from any such incident.
- 14. No person shall be allowed in the ring during judging except the Judges, Stewards, Reporters, Secretaries and persons in charge of exhibits, unless invited by the President of the Show, Secretary or Convener.
- 15. Any act that, in the opinion of the Judges, Stewards or Convener, is deemed cruel or neglectful (e.g. whip marks) will cause the exhibitor to be barred from the class. Severe cases will be reported to the appropriate authority.
- 16. An exhibit which in the opinion of the Committee has been fraudulently or wrongly entered may be disqualified and the exhibitor disqualified from taking prizes at the Show at which such exhibit has been so fraudulently or wrongfully entered.
- 17. The Committee reserves the right to refuse or accept any entry or having received the same, to refuse to allow the exhibit to compete without assigning any reason therefore.
- 18. Any person proved to the satisfaction of the Committee to have been guilty of any fraudulent or discreditable conduct in connection with any entry form or exhibit or of using abusive or unseemly remarks to a Judge or Official may, in addition to forfeiting all prize-money awarded at the Show at which such conduct may occur, be declared incapable of competing for or winning any prizes at any Show held by this Committee for such period as the Committee may decide.

- 19. Any owner, rider or exhibitor refusing to obey any reasonable order of the Steward in charge may have his/her exhibit withdrawn from consideration of the Judge and be disqualified from further competing at the Show in addition to forfeiting all prize money awarded.
- 20. Ages stipulated are as at the date of the Show.
- 21. All riders must wear helmets that comply with Equestrian Australia regulations (please visit equestrian.org.au for more information) and riding boots in all ridden events. No exceptions.
- 22. MAIDEN A horse/pony/rider who has not won a first prize in an individual hack/rider class at any show or gymkhana.
- 23. **NOVICE** A horse/pony/rider who has not won a first prize in an individual open hack/rider class at any Agricultural/Affiliated show or gymkhana.
- 24. Hack, Rider & Jumping events will be run according to E.A. regulations and guidelines.
- 25. LOCAL EVENTS—BOTH RIDER/DRIVER AND HORSE TO RESIDE WITHIN 15KMS OF MACCLESFIELD POST OFFICE.
- 26. Protests to be lodged in writing with Secretary within 10 minutes of the conclusion of event and be accompanied with a cash deposit of \$50. **The Disputes Committee decision will be final.**
- 27. Prizes, trophies and vouchers may be given in lieu of money. All prize monies, vouchers or goods not collected on the day shall be forfeited. The Committee reserves the right to withhold prize monies if less than four competitors in the event.
- 28. **PERPETUAL CUPS/TROPHIES** will be held for display by the Committee and an individual trophy "Keeper" will be provided.
- 29. Ribbons for First, Second and Third unless otherwise stated.
- 30. Royal Show height certificates will be accepted. Committee reserves the right to measure entries where height is specified.
- 31. NO DOGS ON GROUNDS—GUIDE DOGS EXEMPT
- 32. ANY INCIDENT INVOLVING DAMAGE OR INJURY MUST BE REPORTED TO THE SECRETARY'S OFFICE.
- 33. FIRE RESTRICTIONS WILL APPLY. MEDICAL PROVIDER & CFS WILL BE IN ATTENDANCE.
- 34. Hot weather policy: If the weather on show day is forecast to be 36c or over in Macclesfield (as advised on the Bureau of Meteorology app at 4.30 pm on Friday prior to the show) the show will be cancelled. All competitors will be emailed, and a notification will be posted on the Macclesfield Horse Show Facebook page.
- 35. If the show does need to be cancelled for any reason, entries will be refunded excluding the Nominate administration fee.

EVACUATION PROCEDURES: in the event of a fire or other emergency all persons will be directed to the assembly area i.e. centre of the oval.

\*\*Due to the nature of a multi-discipline show, events cannot be coordinated across rings. Competitors must consider overlapping events and prioritise their entries accordingly.\*\*

Walk/Trot horses are unable to canter. Horses competing in Walk/Trot classes are ineligible to compete in Open classes at the same show. Once you have competed in an Open class you are ineligible for Walk/Trot. Newcomer Led and Ridden classes are for horses in their first season of showing or for horses transitioning into Open for their first season. Newcomers are to compete in Newcomer classes only, unless otherwise stated. Novice Open Ridden in for horses in their first season of showing or for Walk/Trot horses transitioning into their first season. Newcomer and Novice Open season extends from the day after the State Championships up to and including the day of the following State Championships. The 2024 State Championships were Feb 18th, any horse which competed on or prior to this day is not Newcomer eligible. Horses are only eligible for either Hack or Hunter and cannot compete in both. Horses must be registered with, and competitors' members of, SPPHASA.




Dress Code: All riders must wear shirt, tie (or polo stock) and jacket (unless summer dress is announced on the day).
