# Directions to assist national judges in terms of welfare and their role as judges.

Extracted from decisions made at the FEI 5\* Meeting Hamburg February 2024.

#### February 2024

Katrina Wuest: Summary message to Judges on all levels.

All participants in equestrian sports, riders, trainers and judges should generally focus on the correctness of the training and thereby ensure the Welfare of the Horse in the sport.

Judges have a special role: They cannot be made responsible for the training of a horse at home, <u>but</u> they set the standards of what should be expected from a correctly trained dressage horse at a show.

We have to ask the following questions:

Is Welfare of the Horse - the most important issue - sufficiently reflected in the marks?

What do we do with visible signs of wrong training or even discomfort such as:

#### a) Incorrect head and neck positions:

- short necks, nose behind the vertical caused by hands used too strongly?
- behind the bit, dropping the contact, refusing to accept the bit worse than just a short neck
- the highest point is not the poll but a point further back, between 2nd and 3rd vertebrae
- · against the hand or above the bit as resistance against the rider's aids

In all these cases the judge has to look whether the faults result from a momentary mistake or are a symptom of long-term incorrect schooling and deduct accordingly - from minus 0.5 for minor cases up to Firewalls (5 or below) in cases of serious deficiencies.

- b) Mouth/ tongue problems these mark proposals partly follow the proposals in the Handbook, partly follow a recent discussion within the JAG/JSP/ IDOC:
  - Tongue slightly visible at the side or below the front of the mouth repeatedly: deduction in the respective movement, if recognizable to the judge,
  - Tongue drawn up under the bit and open mouth 1 point down from the quality in every movement recognizable to the judge.
  - Tongue over bit and hanging out no more than 5 in every movement it is recognizable to the judge, even less after a mistake.
  - Overactive lips: if a horse is happy to work there is no need to be penalised.
  - Grinding teeth: look at the overall picture and check whether it is caused by tension. In this
    case deduction from the quality of the movement

- Incorrect use of reins (contact only with curb rein or reins hanging loose): no deduction if it
  happens momentarily and by mistake, deduction if it is intentional and visible for a longer
  period of time.
- Very dry mouth or excessive masses of foam will act as a signal to take another close look at the suppleness of the horse.

As above under a) the judge has to distinguish between a momentary mistake or a serious basic problem and react accordingly.

#### c) Top line/ back/ tail:

- horse not able to lengthen frame in extended paces and/ or to raise and arch the neck in collection
- stiffness of back
- · severely agitated tail as reaction to rider's leg aids

Mostly a basic problem which has to diminish the mark.

In all these cases (a - c) it is important to give a clear comment to the rider!

#### d) General signs of discomfort/ stress:

- horse is breathing extremely heavily it should be mentioned on the test sheet and if the circumstances require it, such a horse should be rung out (for Welfare reasons)
- extreme sweating (more than normal) or totally over-asked: the horse can also be rung out.
- · ears laid back in an angry way
- · very unhappy, anxious or frightened expression

Mostly a severe basic problem which has to diminish the mark significantly.

All conflict behaviour or signs of stress should be clearly mentioned to the rider in the marks. Furthermore, it must negatively influence the mark for the General Impression and also be summarized in the concluding comments.

#### Are Judges always brave enough to judge what they see?

Very important is the permanent exchange of knowledge and ideas of judges among each other, but also with riders and trainers. **No judge should be left behind**, but every judge must make every effort to learn and improve, also for the future of our sport!

Especially in the times of social media, it is getting more and more difficult for all stakeholders. There is a big difference between serious media which stand for transparency and credibility and social media where anyone can make statements. Obviously, society has changed!

The conditions for horses are better than ever but the sport is endangered to lose its reputation due to inappropriate statements against riders, trainers, judges

Everybody agreed that all needed to be more open, focus more on Horse Welfare and remain honest in their judging. This needs to be reflected, understood and widely communicated.

#### Other issues which have been discussed:

- Horse very uneven, the C judge should ring the bell (except when the
  unevenness/lameness shows only in a lateral movement such as trot half pass) If you sit
  elsewhere mark below 5.
- Collected walk very lateral (3) extended walk can again be good (7.5 -8) Judges not to be biased due to previous bad collected walk.
- Extended walk: there is a trend to "throw away" the reins. If happens, deduct 0.5-1 point from the original mark. Should draw to the bit.
- One tempi changes how much to go down for severe tightness in the neck incl. dropping poll for otherwise 'correct' changes? Proposal: significant deduction. If permanently too short in neck, it cannot be a satisfactory mark anymore.
- Deduct if not enough steps shown in a piaffe (ex. comment: "Nice steps but not enough").
   If additionally travelling, go down further. To be clear in comments why
  going down. See Guidelines for Marking of Fundamental Mistakes in Dressage Movements
- Judges should pay more attention to the precision of riding and deduct accordingly in case of inaccurate execution:
  - Diagonals should be shown exactly from/ to the letters prescribed.
  - Every corner should be shown with clear flexion and bend not with outside flexion.
  - The tempo should be correctly kept collection should not be confused with a medium
    pace.
  - Clear transitions to collection should be shown (and rewarded when well defined).
  - Half passes in trot/ canter should not be started/ finished before the required letter.
     Such an imprecise execution changes the degree of difficulty as the rider has more time to prepare the next movement (e.g. early finish in PSG, early beginning in GPS).
  - The quarter line in zig-zag half passes (5m 10m 5m) should be precisely kept.
  - Zig-zags in canter should be symmetrically designed and not finish before G.
  - The flying change after an extended canter should be the last stride on the diagonal to prove whether both, transition and change, can be shown on a straight line.
  - (Half) pirouettes are often performed outside the required line with the intention of being back on the line at the end after too large a pirouette (e.g. in PSG)

#### Judges Supervisory Panel (JSP) / International Dressage Trainers Club (IDTC)

David Hunt, President of the IDTC, reiterated the JSP's responsibility of ensuring the sport evolved in the correct direction. He showed a set of videos to point out matters the Judges needed to pay attention to.

Collection: Horses are natural athletes capable of extending and collecting. The GP test required 
"collection" several times, and the Judges need to bear in mind that although a horse may be 
spectacular, it should not be awarded high marks if it does not show ability to collect correctly 
when such is part of the requirement of the movement. E.g. for a movement like extended trot, the 
collection should be taken into account coming into and moving out of the movement. The 
requirements of piaffe/passage and correctness of the walk were also discussed.

Correct execution: The Judges need to look if the movement is properly executed (e.g., if it is a real piaffe, acc. to the requirements).

As judges we should not be too impressed by overly spectacular movements if the requirements of the movements are not fully demonstrated. Judges needed to judge what they see in front of them.

The basics had to be correctly in place, and the adjustability to collect and extend shown.

#### FEI JAG- Judging Advisory Group - Canter

Katrina Wüst showed videos with different qualities of canter. She pointed out that judges should not always automatically give a 7 after the horse has successfully managed the transition into canter from passage in the GP but should wait more or less until the end of the movement to give the mark. If marks are given too early the judge misses the opportunity to assess the quality of the canter.

Possible deficiencies regarding the quality which has to diminish the marks significantly:

- Losses of rhythm/ lacking moment of suspension
- · Short, flat on forehand or overactive, hurried.
- · Hind legs stiff, together, not engaged, wide etc., back blocked, angrily.swishing tail
- · Not collected/ or too 'collected', nearly 'climbing', losing fluency

We are very pleased to announce that the Off The Track Thoroughbred Series, introduced in 2023, is back for 2024 and has been rebranded as the Bred to Race Thoroughbred Dressage Series. With the generous sponsorship of ThoroughCare SA, this Series recognises and celebrates the riders who have taken on bred to race thoroughbred horses and retrained them into Dressage horses.

This year, there will be a change to the Series where it will be run as a Leaderboard, with no final competition. # 2024 ThoroughCare SA Dressage Series

With the help of ThoroughCare SA, Dressage SA would like to recognise and celebrate the riders that have taken on bred to race thoroughbred horses and retrained them into dressage horses.

2023 saw the introduction of the ThoroughCare SA, State Dressage Series and we are delighted to announce it's return for 2024. This year there will be an update to the Series where it will be run as a Leaderboard with no final competition.

Series events will be run at different dressage Clubs around the state throughout 2024 with great prize money on offer at each of these Club competitions.

#### ThoroughCare SA updated their eligibility criteria as of 5/10/2023:

"All thoroughbreds registered with the Australian Thoroughbred Studbook and bred for the purpose of racing, including imported thoroughbreds and those who have not trialled or aced are eligible to compete in South Australian "Bred to Race" classes, events and awards. \*Eligibility will be checked through the Registrar of Racehorses, or international equivalents prior to competition"

# MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

To ride at these events riders must either be:

- a) an ESA Competitive member, allowing you to compete in levels Prep through to Elementary, OR
- b) an ESA Participant member, allowing you to compete in levels Prep through to Novice ONLY (Elementary excluded) or
- c) hosting club member, allowing you to compete in levels Prep through to Elementary at the particular hosting club ONLY.




# Southern Flinders Dressage Club

# A Personal Recollection – Mel Adamson

Woohoo - Saturday 27 May 2024 - SADA Pole Clinic with Elke. All fired up to attend - Hubby's first Pole Clinic, so I'm excited for him. (That's the important bit - it's all about HIM!!) BUT, you know how horses are. Yep - everything was all fine in the morning - new hay for



the horses so suddenly we had a heaving, leaping, bucking, racing mess of OTTs and the one lone WB, having a lot of fun. Later that morning we started to grab horses to load up and head over to SADA only to discover Hubby's horse Viz (of course) - one of the mad feral OTTs - had obviously really gotten into the excitement and was now not rideable ... horses - you have to laugh. In steps the "Wife of the Year" (yep that's me ... sometimes LOL): "Don't worry, you can ride Dimi" (my OTT - recently granted Schoolmaster status). Hubby was ok with that, so the OTT and the lone Warmblood load up and off we set for the long drive (about 2 minutes actually) for SADA.

The Clinic was being held in the indoor and it looked amazing. Horses going around, tip-toeing over the poles and generally having fun. Spectators up in the viewing area enjoying the Clinic and Elke looking graceful, having fun with the riders. Now it's our turn. We had three riders: Warmblood - Novice / Elementary, OTT - Schoolmaster who could literally do Pole Clinics with his eyes shut and another young and green Warmblood, at her first Clinic.



A gentle warm-up and arena familiarisation, then it was down the middle and dancing and prancing over the poles. All the "ponies" pranced through well and all riders remained in the saddle (if you know me, at times that is a feat in itself LOL).

We're trotting around and over and through and I'm trying to keep an eye on the Hubby (remember it's his first time, he's a "green" rider AND on my horse) ... literally strike me pink where I sit – there's Hubby

sitting up happily - pointing Dimi in the direction of the poles and I kid you not, that horse has the smuggest look on his face as he is literally Passaging over the poles, with the most elegant of pauses at the top of each stride.

I'm gob smacked and there's the Hubby with absolutely no idea of what's happening underneath him (nor how lucky he is) just "trotting" around enjoying himself to the max (which is what the Pole Clinic was about).



Thankfully for my sanity, Dimi did settle down to just a plain trot and Hubby advised me that he totally enjoyed himself. Elke was a fun and knowledgeable instructor,

working well with the different levels of horses and riders - adjusting and accommodating for all. If anyone was wondering whether Pole Clinics are for me, or I'm not an advanced enough rider - don't worry. Elke proved very well how three different levels of riders / horses can all be accommodated in the one session with no one "missing out".

There were some more advanced canter poles for the Warmblood. The Hubby did some cantering but not over poles (very good call) and the young green horse again did some canter work, but not over the poles. All enjoyed themselves and the horses were smiling too. Now I just have to "wrestle" my horse away from the Hubby. Many thanks to SADA and Elke; we both look forward to the next Clinic.

## From DCSA's AGM - May 3<sup>rd</sup> 2024

#### President's Report:

Our Club has continued to grow in membership and support and we completed 2023 with our Club Championship event in the form of a Gala, going into the early evening. It was a different concept for SA Dressage as we continue to introduce new ideas and events into the sport.

We moved from Nominate to Event Secretary this season and after a slightly stressful start, like anything new, the fabulous scorers Di and Denise have nailed it. They recently scored for a class that included two Judges undertaking an exam during our two-day April show.

Our Facebook page now has 2,320 followers including 16 from the UK, 11 from the US, 9 from South Africa and 9 from NZ with a smattering of other countries. Instagram has 244 followers, up from 173 last year with just 26 posts. Both increased in numbers from the previous year, with minimal focus.

With our two arenas and uncapped rider entry numbers at HOTY events, we have moved to four two-day shows in 2024 and a December Club Championship event. We have also invested some Club finances into an Interstate Judge for each of our four two-day shows this year.

We were successful in gaining a Government grant, thanks to Committee member Alexi Kentish and we are putting it towards purchasing our new equipment trailer.

Sponsors have again been extremely generous to us and we have great relationships with many of the leading equine stores and suppliers, as well as horse enthusiasts who love to support us. We offered sponsorship packages this year and have two naming rights sponsors for the 2024 HOTY shows, with a cash contribution that goes towards our Interstate Judges.

Para Equestrian riders were welcomed as well as OTT classes as part of the ThoroughCare SA series and both will be offered again in 2024, with the Para classes already completed this month.

Tiny Tot classes welcomed back a gang of enthusiastic little riders but we hit a snag with the EA rules halting that class literally the week of our April show. With insurance knowledge from Club supporter Ryan Fletcher and dogged perseverance we were able to begin CR Prep classes for riders 5-10 years of age with certain age rules. A great sponsor, Michele Prince from Four Leaf Milling, has stepped forward and the DCSA Junior Rider Squad is now underway, with the classes being scheduled for the last three shows of this year and further plans being developed.

Again, this year the Committee is indebted to our background supporters, who assist in Judges' liaison, event management, technical updating of reports and the production of draws, as well as countless other tasks. Lisa Ashby, Sue Brown, Kate Moser, Kathryn Mitchell, our legendary scorers Di Pritchard and Denise Piggott, all over and above our sensational Committee! Many thanks to previous MC and advisor Shelley Arnold, who hung up her DCSA volunteer hat at the end of the year.

We sincerely hope that you know how much we appreciate each and every one of you.

My personal thanks go to our Committee as we plan over Winter for the rest of our competition year. They are such an awesome group of smart and passionate people and I hope all of their faces will appear to continue on for the 2024 season.
