KERING IN THE FEED ROOM:

what is stabilised rice bran?

What is stabilised rice bran and why has it gained popularity among horse owners?

Stabilised rice bran is the outer brown layer of the rice kernel, rich in fat, B vitamins, and phosphorus. 

2025 DRESSAGE & JUMPING WITH THE STARS



The 2025 Dressage and Jumping with the Stars event was held in Werribee in March and included the National Young Horse Championships and a leg of the Wordl Cup Qualifiers. This prestigious competition saw our SA riders and their equine partners performing beautifully across an array of categories, showcasing skill, precision, and dedication.

YOUNG HORSE CHAMPIONSHIPS

4-YEAR-OLD HORSE

Susie Verco, riding Ultimate Cera Z, scored 62.6% in round one, landing in 33rd place, in addition to this Susie also WON round one of the 4YO Jumping Horse Championships. With these solid performances, Susie & Ultimate Cera Z were awarded the Ester Bellis Trophy for the best performed combination in the dressage and jumping classes, a testament to her and her horse's potential and versatility!

Keeley Menadue partnered Cheryl Hatswell's, PS Chimes, putting up an impressive score of 74.8% in round one, clinching 16thplace. Following this strong performance, Keeley participated in the 4YO Consolation Round, where they scored 67.6%, ultimately finishing in 20th

5-YEAR-OLD HORSE

The 5-Year-Old Horse category was equally competitive. Keeley Menadue once again stood out, this time riding her own PS Can Dance. In Round One, they scored 69%, securing 16th place. Keeley & PS Can Dance then triumphed in the 5YO Consolation Round, emerging as the WINNER.

5-YEAR-OLD PONY

Cate Rudland and Rainbow Elegance BHI put forth solid performances, starting with 69.8% in Round One, which earned them 5th place.

Their consistency continued into Round Two, where they scored 66%, finishing in 6th.

Sarah Price competing in her first DJWTS riding her own Burren-Dah Aurora, also showed a solid performance, with a score of 69.6% in Round One, secured 6th place, followed by a respectable performance in Round Two, scoring 65.8% and finishing 7th.

6-YEAR-OLD PONY

Among the competitors in the 6-Year-Old Pony division, Steph Hann stood out with her impressive ride on Georgie Ray's Miss Holly Golightly BHI. The duo achieved a remarkable score of 73.8% in Round One, securing 2nd place. They maintained their performance through to Round Two, scoring 73% and once again finishing 2nd, ultimately earning the title of Reserve National 6-Year-Old Pony





2025 DRESSAGE & JUMPING WITH THE STARS



FEI CLASSES PRIX ST GEORGES CUP

In the PSG (Prix St. Georges) cup, Fiona Guthrie-Smith was very busy being SA's only rider in the FEI classes but riding 4 horses across the classes. In the PSG she rode new mount, Verondina Artomous to a score of 63.676%, placing 17th in a highly competitive field. On another horse Dornfeld Don Dorito bred by Fiona and owned by Heather Guthrie achieved a score of 60.981%, which earned her 23rd place.

GRAND PRIX WORLD CUP

As one of the most anticipated segments of the event, the World Cup provided exhilarating moments and showcased elite talent.

Fiona Guthrie-Smith competiting in her first ever World Cup Competition, saw her ride the young Bluefields Denior, owned by Jamie Smith in the Grand Prix, where she scored 65.543%, placing 4th and narrowly missing the lead by just 1.35%. Not only did she qualify for the GP Freestyle with 'Dino' she also posted a score of 63.804% on Paige Whitehead's, Levade This securing 8th place and a spot into the finale!

In the Freestyle event, always a crowd favourite, Fiona continued her strong introductory performance at this level with a score of 67.820%, finishing in 6th place on Bluefield Denoir and a 65.715%, placing 10th.

4-5 YO RISING STARS: YOUNG PONIES

-Cate Rudland, with her pony re-entered the arenas after her performance in the Young Pony Classes with Rainbow Elegance BHI, finished 5th, further adding to her accolades for the weekend. This competitive environment fosters growth and development for young riders and their mounts.

In the Current Ridden Performance Pony category, Eliza Spiers and Hillswood Beatrice demonstrated strong horsemanship, finishing in 9th place.

Stewards are now an integral part of any official competition day, supporting riders, judges and the OC to ensure events run smoothly with their motto of "Help, Prevent, Intervene". National dressage stewards now have a pathway to becoming an FEI steward within Australia. If you are interested in becoming a steward or progressing to be an FEI Steward, contact Dressage SA for details of upcoming training days.

Upgrading judges now have the option of doing their theory exam though an on-line process. This means that they can do the exam in the comfort of their own home, while still testing their knowledge. Judges preparing for their theory exam will be given the option of the new on-line system or can do a paper-based exam as is currently done. Contact the Judges subcommittee for more detail if interested.

Congratulations and thankyou to Tamsin Adcock and Janene Clark for stepping up to become our newest Judge mentors. Tamsin and Janene are both C level judges with a wealth of experience that they can pass on to new and upgrading judges as they work on their Shadow-judging and Sit-ins. Summary - How to become a Dressage Judge

Equestrian Australia has developed a National Officiating Accreditation Scheme (NOAS) that sets the requirements for becoming a judge.

To become a new judge, applicants must:

- be at least 17 years of age
- be a member of the EA (at least Supporter category)
- complete the G Level Expression of Interest Form, on page 4 of <u>How to Become a Dressage Judge (G-E)- Jan</u>
 2024.pdf
- have some experience as a rider, coach, writer/penciller
- attend an EA approved G, F or G/F level seminar
- have completed the relevant sit-ins, and shadow-judged the required number of tests (more detail is in the workbook)
- have successfully completed the current G Level <u>Open</u> <u>Rule Book Test</u>, and
- complete the Australian Institute of Sport (AIS)

WHAT IS PARA-EQUESTRIAN?

LET'S UNDERSTAND PARA & VIRTUS AS A SPORT

PARA-EQUESTRIAN (**PE**) is the term used to describe targeted competitions and activities for riders who have physical or visual impairments. These include the FEI Para Driving and Para Dressage with Para Dressage being the ONLY Paralympics discipline. There are other emerging sports, such as driving, vaulting, and showjumping.

The competitor's mobility, strength, and coordination are assessed to establish their Classification Profile. If you are a rider with a Visual Impairment the classification is a touch different and run by Paralympics Australia. **The Grades range from Grade I (1) for the most severely impaired to Grade V (5) for the least impaired.** Specifically designed dressage tests allow riders to show their skills and make the competition a level playing field for athletes.

Grades	Athlete Description	Type of Para Dressage Test
Grade I	Riders with the greatest impairments usually requiring a wheelchair	Walk only tests Arena size: 20m x 40m
Grade II	Riders with impairments requiring crutches, wheelchairs, major support equipment	Walk & trot tests Arena size: 20m x 40m
Grade III	Riders who may use a wheelchair or walking aids	Walk and trot tests but canter is permitted in a freestyle test Arena size: 20m x 40m
Grade IV	Riders who have more mobility. Riders who may be sight impaired	Walk, trot, canter and may show lateral work in freestyle tests Arena size: 20m x 60m
Grade V	Riders with an impairment that measures a minimum of 17% of body function	Walk, trot, canter, canter, 3 and 4 sequence changes and lateral work in freestyle tests Arena size: 20m x 60m



WHAT IS PARA?

LET'S UNDERSTAND PARA & VIRTUS AS A SPORT



YOU KNOW, YOU TOO
COULD BE A PARAEQUESTRIAN AND NOT
EVEN REALISE IT

You may have an injury, an underlying medical condition, vision loss and/or other impairments which could enable you to be classified.

There are also opportunities for riders with intellectual disabilities to classify for Virtus Dressage.

Many of us were not sure if we would qualify until we went through the process.

To give you an idea, some SA riders have multiple sclerosis and others are amputees, have rheumatoid arthritis or have a permanent injury with an impairment that measures a minimum of 17% of body function. If you would like to find out more or begin the process, you can

A call out of thanks is not enough for the incomparable Sue Brown who is just a massive help in every way to our events, and we love having her with us.

A lot of lovely compliments about the quality of riders and their horses came from our A level judge Judy, which just so great to hear, and we thank her for mentoring Cheryl Hatswell and facilitating shadow judging to help Cheryl work towards elevating her judging level.

A minimum of two DCSA shows must be attended for points to count

Points will not be back dated.

One rider may enter the same award on multiple horses or may enter different horses for different awards but cannot nominate the same horse for multiple awards.

THE SIX CATEGORIES FOR DCSA CLUB CHAMPIONS

- Youth
- Senior Prelim & Novice (AOR & Open)
- Senior Elementary, Medium & Advanced (AOR & Open)
- FEI
- Pony
- CR

Categories must be correctly nominated on the entry form & checked by the competitor prior to the show via the official published draw. Categories will not be changed on the day of the show, & points will be allocated as per the results.

Youth rider age is from the beginning of the calendar year in which the rider turns ten years for horses and eight years for ponies to the end of the calendar year in which the rider turns 21. This is a combined group based on current EA Rules for Juniors and Young-Riders.

To qualify as an Amateur Owner Rider (AOR), riders must declare that they meet the criteria as set out in the National Dressage Rules.4.6.1. It is the AOR's responsibility to ensure they have made it clear on their entries that they are entering as an AOR and to ensure that the draw clearly states they are competing as an AOR - this cannot be backdated. If the rider is not listed on the draw an AOR combination, they cannot accrue points for that specific competition. The onus is on the rider to make it clear prior to the competition.

CR (Closed Restricted) is for Member entries only. To gain Leaderboard points in the CR category, the rider and horse are to be unofficial.

Points are awarded for placings as per the tables below for the tests at each DCSA competition.

If there is equality in points accrued at the completion of the calendar year, the next best-placed tests will be used to determine a winner. If there is still equality, then all will be announced as winners.

DCSA reserves the right to review if and when needed, and the DCSA decision is final.

A big thank you to all for the HUGE Sunday we had in March.


The committee appreciated everyone's patience and understanding and also the generosity for the new Fundraising initiative for the PA System.

2025 ThoroughCare SA Dressage Series

With the help of ThoroughCare SA, Dressage SA would like to recognise and celebrate the riders that have taken on bred to race thoroughbred horses and retrained them into dressage horses.

Once again ThoroughCare SA has supported us to run the State Dressage Series. With the success of the leaderboard format in 2024 the series will run under the same method.

Series events will be run at different dressage Clubs around the state throughout 2025 with great prize money on offer at each of these Club competitions.

ThoroughCare SA updated their eligibility criteria as of 5/10/2023:

"All thoroughbreds registered with the Australian Thoroughbred Studbook and bred for the purpose of racing, including imported thoroughbreds and those who have not trialled or aced are eligible to compete in South Australian "Bred to Race" classes, events and awards.
*Eligibility will be checked through the Registrar of Racehorses, or international equivalents prior to competition"

MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

To ride at these events riders must either be:

- a) an ESA Competitive member, allowing you to compete in levels Prep through to Elementary, OR
- b) an ESA Participant member, allowing you to compete in levels Prep through to Novice ONLY (Elementary excluded) or
- c) hosting club member, allowing you to compete in levels Prep through to Elementary at the particular hosting club ONLY.

Two tests will be offered at each Club at each level Rosettes will be presented to the 1st – 3rd place getters in each test at each level

- c) third placed will be allocated 33 points and so on to the last placed horse
- d) competitors must compete in both tests at the level nominated to be eligible for points
- e) the winner is the horse with the highest combined points from the two tests
- f) in the event of a tie, the winner will be the horse with the highest aggregate percentage at that level
- g) in the event of a further tie, the horse with the highest percentage in the higher competition at that level will be deemed the winner

Prizemoney will be presented to the overall 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winners of the combined tests at each level, using rule 3.19

- a) winners will be determined by the highest accumulative points from each series competition. Points will be award for level placings as follows 1st=6pts 2nd=5pts 3rd=4pts 4th=3pts 5th=2pts 6th=1pt
- b) in the event of a tie, the winner will be the horse with the highest percentage single test at that level for the series.
- c) in the event of a further tie, the horse with the highest percentage in the higher single test at that level for the series will be deemed the winner
- d) Custom made rugs will be presented to the Series winners featuring the ThoroughCare SA logo at each level
- e) Leaderboard winners will be presented with rugs at the SA State Dressage Championships to be held at the SVDC grounds 14-16November 2025 (no ThoroughCare competition will be held on those dates, only the presentation of the rugs to the Leaderboard winners)
