Judges' Education Opportunities

Riders and spectators are welcome to attend any of the Judge Education Seminars: they are a great opportunity to learn what Judges can see and how marks are awarded.

Upgraded Judges

Congratulations to Wendy Schaefer-MacDonald passing her D-level exam at SIEC.

Performance Medals

The National Dressage Performance Medals are awarded each year to combinations who have obtained the following in the qualifying period:

Gold Medals (Does not include Freestyles):

- Novice or Elementary level 3 performances of 75% or more at each level
- Medium or Advanced level 3 performances of 70% or more at each level
- PSG or Inter I (Small Tour) 3 performances of 70% or more across the small tour
- Inter II or Grand Prix (Big Tour) 3 performances of 70% or more across the Big Tour.

Details are on the EA website. Applications for the Medals close on Wednesday October 2^{nd} .

Directive on Judging Riders taking the incorrect canter lead

in EA Preliminary and Novice tests

These tests often have successive movements (up to 3) which are impacted by an incorrect lead. This can be expensive for the rider if the incorrect lead is not corrected in a timely way. How to judge to be fair to the riders?

The Queensland Dressage Officials Sub Committee (DQOSC) has developed the following protocol for judging these movements which has been endorsed by EADOC and EADC.

1. If the rider produces an incorrect lead and then corrects it, the score for that movement would be under 5 as it is no longer sufficient and no error is given.

2. If the rider is on the wrong lead by the time of the next (second) canter movement is started <u>without any attempt</u> to correct the lead (usually through lack of awareness of which lead they are on) then in fairness to that rider it is appropriate for the bell to be rung to stop them and give them an opportunity to develop the correct lead. And one (1) error only is recorded.

3. If still unsuccessful then that movement and the successive movement should be marked accordingly and no further errors recorded for that instance.

4. When a canter from one lead is not shown in the test at all, not only the incorrect movements are scored low, the collective score for Paces, Submission and Rider are also affected.

Victorian Amateur Owner Rider Championships 2024 BIG TOUR CHAMPION



Anita Moss and her horse, Freddie, a 17hh, 6-year-old Friesian Warmblood, had the incredible opportunity to ride in a lesson with Jayden Brown.

This lesson was part of the 2024 Equissage National AOR Championships, held on September 21-22 at Boneo Park, Victoria and Jayden's first appearances in Australia after his remarkable performance with Willinga Park Quincy at the Paris Olympics.

We caught up with Anita to hear about this amazing experience!

"I was so thrilled and terrified all at the same time when I got accepted, out of over 50 applicants, only 15 riders were chosen based on their five-minute video submissions!

During the lesson, I learnt invaluable techniques for enhancing my riding. We focused on activating the hind legs and pushing from behind, rather than just speeding up with quick, short steps. Jayden had me work on suppleness and self-carriage, which made a huge difference in our performance."

What did you think of Jayden's coaching style?

"He is a wonderful coach—patient and clear in his explanations. He really took the time to ensure I understood each concept. He even complimented Freddie, saying he would look great in his stable and praised his lovely breeding and conformation."

What is your history and plan with Freddy?

"I bought Freddie when he was just two years old, falling in love with him the moment. He's always willing to try anything I ask of him. Together we have competed at the Preliminary and Novice levels, with plans to move up to Elementary in 2025. Freddie has already achieved a Dressage Gold Medal at the Preliminary level and is part of the Dressage South Australian AOR future squad."

Did you achieve what you wanted from the lesson?

"Reflecting on the experience, I felt a mix of excitement and accomplishment. I truly felt a sense of achievement and happiness after the lesson. My aim was to improve for the National AOR competition, and I feel I accomplished that goal that ending up with 3rd and 8th place in the preliminary classes. A special thank you goes to the AOR Committee for organizing such a fantastic opportunity and to Hi Form Australia for supporting this momentous event."



Catherine Viney

AUSTRALIAN REPRESENTATIVE

My name is Catherine Viney and I am an equestrian rider from South Australia who has begun competing internationally in Virtus competitions in the III category.

I learnt to ride when I was eight years old at the Riding for the Disabled Association in Victor Harbor. My mum used to come to school every Tuesday and walk me across the road to the pony club grounds for my fortnightly lessons in my lunch break. I really enjoyed learning to ride and so I decided to continue as it was fun and I enjoyed getting to know the horses.

As my riding got better, I moved to The Riding Patch at Strathalbyn where my coach lives to become more competitive. Kathy Angel has taught me so much along with her daughter (Noella Angel).

About 3 years ago, Mary Longden, one of Australia's leading para coaches, came over from Victoria to teach me for some lessons. She mentioned an international sporting organisation for people with an intellectual impairment (Virtus). Immediately, I was interested, so my mum and I researched some more. It turns out I was able to join this organisation and could compete against other people with an intellectual disability too.

I began competing with my horse Lucy in local competitions regularly. This was fantastic as I gained a lot of experience and learned that competing is a lot of fun. I have an exemption for a caller to read the test out aloud via an earpiece when I am competing, as I find it challenging to remember each test. When I was accepted into Virtus in April this year, my mum floated me, my horse Lucy, my coach and groom to Rosebud just past Melbourne to compete in my first CPEDI event at Boneo Park. I did well and rally enjoyed the experience, so we decided to go to SIEC in Sydney to compete in June at the next CPEDI event. I was really happy with my results as they were getting better, and I was enjoying the experiences offered to me.

Then I discovered Virtus runs quite a few international online competitions which require someone filming me riding in an arena and sending the video into Sports Inclusion Australia who then forward them onto Virtus to be judged.

I learned a lot and enjoyed these experiences so much, when there was talk of the 2024 Virtus Open European Equestrian Championships opening to Australia, I was very interested.

Shortly afterwards I received an email from Sports Inclusion Australia asking if I would be interested in competing and representing Australia in England. After speaking to my family, I forwarded my name saying I was keen. Within a week, the Australian team was selected, and I was on my way. This was an amazing dream and because it was not originally open to Australia, when it did open, we had less than two months to prepare, so it needed to be selffunded.

My mum and dad joined me on my trip to England, along with my coach Kathy Angel and trainer Esther Cruckshank. We had a few days of sightseeing, and then we arrived at our hotel at Norton Park with the rest of Australian team several days later.

We began with some team building activities to help the our team of eight riders get to know each other better. There were five of us in the III from Australia, one in the II2 category and two in the II3 category. I was the only rider from South Australia, and even though I knew some of the riders from other events, it was great to meet new riders both from around Australia and from other countries.

Our Australian team did not take horses, in fact the only country who rode on their own horses was Great Britain. Fortunately, for me, I was able to train on a variety of horses at The Riding Patch to help prepare me for this competition beforehand, and several days before the competition, my coach and trainer selected a lovely pinto called Delilah for me to ride. She was owned by Sparsholt Equine College which is where the competition was held too. I had three rides to get to know the horse before the competition. Although this was not long, I felt safe on her and she did everything I asked of her.

Day One of the competition, I rode the Grade 4 Para Novice B Test along with all the other II1 riders. Surprisingly, I was not as nervous as I had expected myself to be, and I went out to give it my best effort with my mum calling the test for me. I was very happy with my horse and my score of 64.17%.

The following day, I rode the Grade 4 Para Intermediate A Test with my mum calling again. Again, with a couple of adjustments, I was able to get a PB of 65.60%.

I was so proud of my horse, my team and my own efforts, not to mention the numerous people who had supported me in my journey. The experience was so much fun. I ended up coming 6th in the III category. I learned so much throughout this experience and indeed, in the few months leading up to this competition.

My next international competition will be another Virtus online video competition in November. These are great fun to be a part of, and the results are sent electronically to all the nations who compete. Next year, I am hoping to travel interstate again to compete against other III riders and hopefully get selected again to represent Australia in the next competition next year in Great Britain again.

Horse riding is something I have been involved with since I was 8 years old. It has helped me in so many ways and it has shaped me to be the person I am today. I feel so fortunate for the opportunities that have been presented before me and am looking forward to more South Australians joining me as Virtus riders in the future.


